

Web server (thttpd): How can I use SSI?

SSI (Server Side Include) is a technique where a HTML document is first parsed by a program on the server (hence the name) before it is presented to the client (i.e. a browser).

This page describes how to use Server Side Include or SSI using a special CGI program. The advantage of I've made a small tarball with the required binary (ssi.cgi) and a small demo, this is how you install it:

Now point your favorite browser to http://your.domain.name/cgi/ssi.cgi/ssi/ssi_demo.shtml or if you don't have a [dyndns](#) domain name, then use the IP address of your FREESCO box to view the page, e.g. http://192.168.0.1/cgi/ssi.cgi/ssi/ssi_demo.shtml
